MEMBER HIGHLIGHTS

Jo Linda Jara Martínez Recognized with the WAVE Award, *Wise Accomplished Valued Elder, Summer,* 2020 for a Legacy of Educational Leadership and Service



In August, The Focus Network and Tarrant County District honored Jo Linda and various community leaders such as former mayor, Kenneth Barr, Louise Appleman, longtime community activist, and others who served the community and education.

Following the example of her father, Manuel Jara, Jo Linda sought to be a servant leader as an advocate, teacher, and mentor to thousands of children and young adults. Throughout her adult life, Jo Linda served young people as a campfire leader, den mother, religious education teacher, classroom teacher, coordinator of the Bilingual Teacher Assistant Program. A highlight of her career, Jo Linda founded the leadership program Hispanic Youth Promoting Excellence (HYPE) that expanded to other leadership initiatives under the umbrella of *Absolute Xcellence* (AX). Operating with a "youth leading youth" model, the goal was to develop leaders by first focusing on communication skills and soon evolving into opportunities to lead younger students. Using Hispanic literature as a means of connecting, students gained an appreciation of their culture, a desire for higher education, and the ability to fulfill their own potential as our next leaders.

By vocation, Jo Linda was a Bilingual/ESL educator until her retirement in 2008. She is a product of FWISD and earned a B.A. from Texas Wesleyan University. Taking breaks to rear her children, she spent 30 of 42 years serving the FWISD Bilingual/ESL Department in many capacities.

Among some of the honors Jo Linda has received are Who's Who Among American Educators, Texas Woman Power of One Award, Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Teacher Award, the United Hispanic Council Outstanding Achievement Award, Dieciséis de Septiembre Outstanding Volunteer Award, Department of Commerce Minority Enterprise Development Regional Director's Award, the Outstanding Woman of Fort Worth Commissioners' Award – Women Who Inspire Learning as well as numerous awards of appreciation for volunteerism from other organizations. She has served on many boards including Delta Kappa Gamma, Anytown Advisory Board, TCU Leadership Advisory Board AAUW Sister to Sister Summit Co-chair and is currently a member of the MACE Board.

Today, Jo Linda's passion is enjoying time with her husband, Jesse, four children, and eleven grandchildren. Even though she cannot see them in person due to Covid-19, the stories, photos, and video calls continue to be the joy of her life.
